# Clarifying

## Problems:

- Reread, reread, reread.
- Read on for clues.
- Check the parts of the word I know.
- Blend the sounds of the word.
- Reread the sentence to see if it makes sense.
- Try another word.

That's clearer!



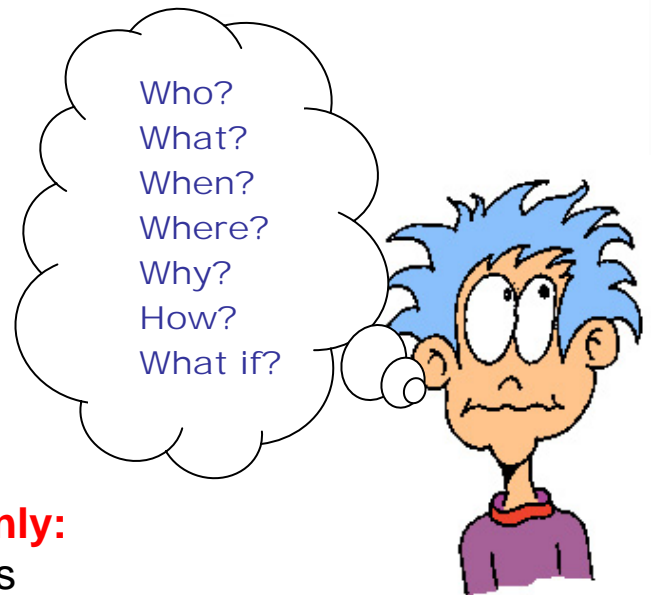
# Questioning

## When questioning with fiction and nonfiction:

- Ask questions based on the text.
- Ask questions that are based on the main idea.
- Ask some detail-oriented questions.
- Ask some inferential questions.

## When questioning with nonfiction only:

- Ask questions based on text features such as maps, captions, and diagrams.



## When summarizing fiction:

- Retell the story in your own words. Include the setting, characters, problem, key events, and resolution.
- Give only key points that add up (+) to a short summary.
- Use logical order.
- Reread to remember main ideas.
- Refer to illustrations to summarize.
- Use Somebody Wanted But So.

## When summarizing nonfiction:

- Leave out unnecessary details.
- Refer to illustrations, headings, and other text features.
